Do I Make A Difference?

My name is Patrice Bryant Akers, and I am the Treasurer for Horse Protection. I have been doing bookkeeping for most of my life – learning from my mother at the age of 10 and continuing the family business for over 50 years.

I like numbers. They are black and white. They are logical. You are either "in balance" or you're not. You are in "the red" or in "the black". There are no shades of gray or in-betweens. And, if the books don't balance, you can always find the answer by taking logical steps. Accounting is good for me. It balances the logical part of my life with the emotional ~ and that's where the horses come in....

I've always loved horses, taking after my father who told me stories of his beloved "Chief" all through-out my childhood. I was never around horses, but always wanted them. So, 7 years ago when my mother said to my husband & me "Let's do it!", we packed up our home in SoCal and moved to Ocala to our quaint 5 acre farm – Psalms Farm. I had no idea the journey that would come.

We rescued all 3 of our herd members and began to study Natural Horsemanship (a pre-requisite from one of the adoption centers). We began training with Christine Massinger and that is when the "relationships" with these incredible beings began. Like so many others, we were extremely ignorant to their deep sensitive nature, to their empathic way of communicating, and their capacity to heal and help humans on a physical and emotional level. Our 3 guys changed over the months/years and have become who they were always meant to be - confident, fun-loving, playful, respectful and trusting of humans - but most importantly, desiring to be with us, hang out with us - which is literally like the lamb laying down with the lion. The ultimate prey animal - the ultimate predator - becoming one in partnership.



I write this as a segue way into coming to Horse Protection. I know (logically in my head) the abuse, the abandonment that happens from humans to equine (not limited to), but I suppose my heart was not quite prepared for the atrocities that I witnessed or heard about – difficult for me to wrap my head around –

However - I have also seen some of the miracles that have happened as a result of our loving and caring team. If, at any point, I become discouraged or overwhelmed with the "numbers" of equine alone that need help, I simply need to look to our team. Our farm manager, Lisa, who does the actual intake of the wounded and works side by side with our Executive Director Christine - our team of equine associates - Chelsea, Tammy, Michele, Stephanie – our amazing volunteers....They suit up and show up each day and love on these guys in a way that re-builds a foundation of trust for the equine to the human. A bond that has been so severely broken, that only time, patience and a genuine heart can heal.

In November 2021, Pablo a white Paso Fino, was dropped off and abandoned at Horse Protection – extremely emaciated with a body of score of 2, with, no



less, a saddle on his back (which pretty much says it all...). When he first arrived, Pablo would stand with his back to everyone – facing away – head down, eyes averted. I saw several of the team try to coax him with a treat or come close – slowly, slowly – Nope! Going to stay far, far away from any human!!

Fast forward middle of March 2022. I had not been to Horse Protection since December's "Blessing of the Animals" due to tax season etc. I was at Horse Protection for the Lead from Within workshop. During the break, everyone goes on a tour of the facility to meet some of the residents. About 20+ people were in attendance and on this tour. As I look over to the round pen where Pablo is, I see him trotting quickly to the fence greeting all 20+ people!! Not a human that he knew or was familiar with, but over 20 predators that he was willing to come say hello to - What TRUST!! Oh, my heart be still!!!

What this team has done for this one individual each and every day...feeding, caring, grooming, mucking, singing & whistling while they work (thank you sweet Chelsea!) – each part, each person has helped in restoring our amazing Pablo.

So, "do I make a difference?" I think the more appropriate question is "do we make a difference?"

Do I Make A Difference? CONTINUED

We are a team. A team of people from various backgrounds who have a common passion – a passion that is expressed in our Code of Values:

"We place the welfare of the Horse Protection equine first. We commit whole heartedly to our duty of protecting them. As their stewards, we base all our decisions on our entrusted service to them. We acknowledge that Horse Protection is greater than any one individual. We therefore proudly join as a unified team ethically working to promote our mission."



Dr. Sarah Garcia DVM, CVA, is an equine practitioner and the owner of Southern Performance Veterinary Acupuncture and Wellness. She grew up in South Carolina, riding and competing hunter/jumpers. She earned her B.S. in Biology from Wofford College and received her DVM from Ross University School of Veterinary Medicine. Dr. Garcia received her certification in veterinary acupuncture and completed the Advanced Equine Acupuncture course at the Chi University in Reddick, FL. She will be attending Chi University again this fall to earn her certification in Equine Rehabilitation and Performance Medicine.

Dr. Garcia lives in Gainesville, FL with her husband and two boys. She and her family are members of a BMX Racing Team, Team 352 BMX sponsored by Bikes and More, and they enjoy spending time at their home track in High Springs and traveling on the weekends to race at tracks across the state.

WHAT KIND OF PRACTICE IS SOUTHERN PERFORMANCE?

Southern Performance is a mobile veterinary acupuncture practice that combines both conventional and Traditional Chinese Veterinary Medicine (TCVM) to provide high quality integrative care. HOW WILL AN OWNER KNOW WHAT SERVICE IS RIGHT FOR THEIR HORSE?

That's my job! Every new client and patient starts with an initial "New Client Appointment". These appointments include a thorough patient history, a conventional physical exam integrated with a TCVM exam, a standing orthopedic exam, and a diagnostic scan. The appropriate treatment modality will be determined based on the physical exam findings, the diagnostic scan, and the temperament of the horse. Each horse is different and will have a different threshold for needles and stimulation. My goal for each treatment session is to provide a relaxing environment that will optimize treatment results. The number of followup appointments and the treatment modality used will be determined at each visit.
