



MUSTANGS RESCUED FROM NEGLECT NOW THRIVING AT HORSE PROTECTION



Just last month we learned of sixteen horses in Williston Florida who were in desperate need. Several of them were starving and all of them were severely neglected. Thanks to you, our donors, we were able to assist at this time of great need. We joined with another rescue, the OTTB Foundation, to help the horses.

Veterinarians were called to the scene and rendered aid. We were able to provide donations for feed, hay, and farrier care. Most of the horses were provided foster homes. However, there were four Mustangs who needed refuge. Horse Protection took the Mustangs in and have provided them a safe sanctuary. They are now in Horse Protection's care. They were not used to human interaction when they arrived, but they are now learning to trust.

What a beautiful site to see these wild mustangs learning that humans can be good and kind. Thank you to all of you for helping to save their lives! We could not do it without you!

MEET THE MIRACLE MINIS



Just four months ago, Horse Protection received a call regarding a miniature horse who was abandoned and discarded at a training facility near Orlando. When the staff at that facility found the little mini on their property, he was untouchable. He was frightened of any human interaction. The facility did the best they could for him and put him in a stall where he stayed for several weeks without any human touch. Each time they would try to touch him, he would become severely anxious. Horse Protection was called by the facility to help the little guy and so we did! We took him in just three months ago and as part of his training we established mutual respect and trust. We named him Courage because we knew that with love, understanding and patience he would grow to be the brave little boy that he is now.



Six months ago, a beautiful palomino mini was found running on the streets of Pasco County with a stallion weaving in and out of traffic. She and the stallion were taken in by animal control. They stayed at animal control while the officers searched desperately for her owners. Weeks later, the owners were found. But when they were told that they could pick up their mini, the owners said they didn't want her anymore. A rescue by the name of Hope Equine in south Florida took the little mini-in. Horse Protection worked with that rescue to help this little palomino mini. We picked her up from South Florida and brought her here. We named her Love because we wanted her to know that we will never abandon her or forsake her. We will always love her.



We all worry about what would happen to our beloved equines if we were no longer able to care for them. An elderly lady was in that predicament. She had two miniature horses who because of her failing health she was no longer able to feed or care for. She contacted Horse Protection to help her and help her, we did! We came and picked up the two little minis who are mother and daughter and brought them to Horse Protection. We paid to get them up to date on their medical care with vaccinations and feet trimming. The little chestnut mini, who is the mother of the two, we named Hope. We named her Hope because we fulfill the wish of our equine loving community with our devout promise to care for their beloved equines when they are no longer able to. We named the daughter Faith because we are devoted to our mission to help all equines and humans in their time in need and to instill faith in people and animals that we are here for them.




















MEET OUR NEWEST MIRACLE MINI: FORTITUDE!



MEET OUR NEWEST BOARD MEMBER



He is widely recognized as one of the leading environmental and animal law practitioners in the State of Florida and throughout the USA. He received his B.A. and M.A. from Stetson University, studied post-graduate creative writing and literature at The University of Florida, and received his J.D. from FSU College of Law. He is an Adjunct Professor of Animal Law and Environmental Law at FSU College of Law, Florida A&M University, and Tallahassee Community College, and has published over 40 law review, journal, treatise, and textbook articles and chapters. He frequently lectures law students, lawyers, humane advocates, judges, and others statewide on matters relating to animal law, and is a registered lobbyist for The Florida Bar Animal Law Section. He is recognized as a top lawyer in respected national lawyer ranking services including Martindale-Hubbell (top rating 5.0 Preeminent); Florida Super Lawyers (top 5% of Florida environmental lawyers; Chambers USA (top 10 Florida environmental lawyers); Best Lawyers in America; and Who's Who Legal USA. He is past Chair of The Florida Bar Animal Law Section: Environmental & Land Use Law Section; and Florida Bar Journal & News Editorial Board. He regularly represents animal owners in court on animal welfare cases. He represented the Animal Legal Defense Fund and The Florida Bar as a member of the "Greyhound Dream Team" that lobbied and litigated


against greyhound racing and breeding interests and successfully placed the ban on racing on the statewide Florida ballot, which ended greyhound racing in Florida, with a corresponding ripple effect throughout the USA.

With respect to his animal welfare activities, he is a life-long animal lover



and advocate. He co-founded Pets Ad Litem, Inc. a 501c3 charity dedicated to humane education and advocacy; The Tallahassee Animal Shelter Foundation (dedicated to supporting the Tallahassee Animal Service Center); and Geoffrey Bear Foundation (dedicated to veterinarian welfare). He is also a long-time member and advisor to the Leon County Humane Society and other animal welfare organizations. He serves on the City of Tallahassee Animal Crimes Task Force where he advises the city on animal law, and on the Tallahassee Police Department Citizens' Advisory Council, where he advises law enforcement on human and animal crimes. He has a special love and appreciation for horses, having rescued, rehabilitated, fostered, and adopted multiple horses.
